The following bio was printed in the worship folder on June 19th;

"Rev Tom is a native of California; just an hour's drive south of San Francisco. He came to know the Lord while attending a community college and becoming friends with a campus minister. It was through this man that Tom grew in faith and knowledge of Christ's redemptive work on the cross. But it wasn't until a number of years after graduating from San Jose State University that Tom felt God calling him to the ministry.

With the total support of his wife Carole, Tom attended Western Theological Seminary in Portland, Oregon and graduated in 1997.

Since 1998, Rev. Tom has been working as a hospice chaplain, being at the bedside of people with only a short time to live. He has been able to share his faith and hope in the Lord so others

might have the same. Rev. Tom and Carole have four children and eight grandchildren. In 2014, Tom & Carole and their daughter Amanda moved to Preston where he continues in his hospice ministry. Besides sports, Tom loves both writing and reading, and fixing up their old house."

As you have helped me to grow in my faith, and have encouraged me in my ministry, be a support to Rev. Tom. Encourage him. Pray for him – that God would do amazing things through Tom's ministry in Preston.

The Scarecrow Festival will be Saturday, September 24th, from 10 A.M. – 5 P.M. Put the date on your calendar, you don't want to miss it!



FROM THE DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION:



SUMMERTIME is a time for me when I finally tackle all the accumulation in my office! I ran across "Some remembrances of our time at Preston City Congregational Church" sent to us in June 2014 by the Rev. Lawrence A. Washburn who served as minister of this church from December 1955 – December 1959. I hope you find these excerpts as interesting as I did:

LENORE, Bonnie Jean, our 11 month old daughter and I moved in (to the parsonage). There was no kitchen to speak of and one of our requests before accepting the position was for a proper kitchen to be installed. Soon after we arrived that was done. There were other problems with the house, however, one by one taken care of over the years. One story involved the living room ceiling. The plaster was hanging down so much that at any moment the entire ceiling could come down. The trustees looked at it and decided it would last a few more years, but I was worried it would fall on my little daughter, but there didn't seem to be enough money to fix it. About a year later, there was a missionary committee meeting at the parsonage. Most of the women present were 70 years of age or older. Lenore was about 26. She hosted the society every month in the parsonage as was the custom. Right during that meeting the ceiling came crashing down right in the midst of the seven or eight women. The ceiling was fixed the next day!

I WAS thinking, "oh my, things have changed around here!" We no longer have a parsonage, but everything at our church is so well kept up. As much as we have a debt of gratitude to our forebears, we have much to thank our present day stewards for as well!

NEXT is a very interesting story; it is the story of how we finally got inside toilets. It was a rainy, muddy day in March and there was a wedding. The bride was dressed in her beautiful white gown, and right before the wedding ceremony was to take place she had to use the toilet, which was outside "Out house". On the way she slipped and fell in the mud. That was the catalyst for our attempts to install inside toilets. We built them between the steeple and the sanctuary on the first floor. By that time I had learned a bit about ministry that they didn't teach you in seminary. In fact I'm sure that this church gave me more of an education than I realized in church politics and getting things done. I learned that you had to go slow and build a coalition of people who wanted to do the same thing that you wanted to do.

THERE are more interesting stories we thank Rev, Washburn for sharing that I will address in future newsletter issues. Thank you Rev. Washburn, for orchestrating those inside toilets!

THANKFULLY we are in a church that always has its eye to the future and someday when we have done what we can do, with God's help and blessing, we will leave well-kept facilities for those who follow us.
