We live in a noisy world, and it's getting worse every day. People speaking over each other, interrupting each other, raising their voice to drown-out someone else's! It drives me CRAZY! Watch just about any TV talk show where there are multiple guests, and you'll see what I mean. It seems whomever speaks or yells the loudest is the victor in having their point be heard, or so they think! I seldom hear anyone when everyone speaks at once. It's just a bunch of noisy sounds.

It reminds me of Miss Othmar, the teacher Linus had a crush on in the Peanuts comic strips/TV specials. You remember her... whenever she spoke, all you heard was, “wah, wah, wah.” Noise made by a slide trombone! In reading about Miss Othmar this week, I read:



A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION...

ALL OF US HAVE HAD things to do in life that have been hard to do! I was recently thinking of that following a few awesome sermons (they're all really good) that Rev. Stan recently gave on what your life (Bible) verse would be. He shared with us his grandmother's as found in her Bible: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not unto thine own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will direct thy paths." (King James Version) He said this verse directed her path until her dying day!

THIS PAST SUNDAY, Shari Purcell delivered an inspiring sermon. Towards the end of it she spoke about the life verse of Rev. Stan's grandmother and how that inspired her.
