WHAT WILL YOU REMEMBER?

Decades from now, when the people of our church look back on the year 2020, most likely at the top of their list of memories will be the life-changing pandemic; the Coronavirus, Covid-19, that changed our world, our country, our lives. They will recall the impact the virus had on our church; briefly closing for in-person worship, the Sunday School coming to an abrupt end for the year in March, children and adults unable to see each other. Hopefully, they will remember the web streaming of Sunday services – an attempt to keep us connected to each other and the *Good News!* What will you remember?

For me, I will remember the faithfulness of our congregation, the people! Although a large percentage of the congregation was unable to attend services because of health concerns, they did not forget that their church was still there for them, doing what it could for those who needed help. I'll never forget the day a member ("Anonymous") wrote me a check for \$2,000 and said, "Use this to help others." Anonymous came to me three more times, each occasion with another check (a total of \$8,000) saying the same thing, "Use this to help others." Many in our congregation have been blessed by this person's act of kindness. Likewise, I will remember the faithful giving of our congregation to support the on-going work of our church through their tithes and offerings arriving in the mail. I call their giving, "Statements of Faith!" I have seen Faith in action; giving and reaching out to others. I think about the words Jesus' brother James said long ago, "Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says!" (James 1:22).

May God continue to have His Hand upon us as we navigate the days still before us. May we stay connected to Him and each other, and may others remember us for being faithful to God and the Church of Jesus Christ.
