GOOD NEWS FROM THE TREASURER

So... during this chaotic year, we were concerned that without fundraisers, we wouldn't be able to meet our budget (\$268,226.00)

GOOD NEWS: as of December 31st, we have *surpassed* the budget in monies donated to the church! PLUS, the following:

- We received \$15,015.00 from the *Special Gift* appeal. Thank you to all who gave!
- We received \$4,536.80 from the two yard sales we had, and the Butter Braid sale.
- Your donations to the clothing shed (even after it was closed because of Covid-19) resulted in a check of \$683.69.

Added to all this good news, was the realization that we spent *less than our budget*, leaving a balance of \$15,160.49.

That's amazing!

Because of your FAITHFULNESS to our church, we will begin the new year with a budget balance of \$49,476.97. With the new year, again being uncertain due to the continued pandemic, this balance plus what has already been pledged to-date for 2021 (\$174,506.00), will ensure support for the 2021 budget of \$245,639.

So, thank you for all that you did (and do) to keep our church financially strong. -- Shirley Hodkinson
