## WORSHIP AND WEB STREAM INFORMATION

Worship services continue to be web streamed *live* on Sunday mornings starting at 9 a.m. Go to *prestoncitycongregational.org*. You can also watch the service later in the day via the archive system also on the site. Those who wish to attend a service (9 or 10:30) MUST contact the church office (860.887.4647) no later than THURSDAY (11 a.m.), and give their name, as well as the number of people who will be attending, and which service they plan to attend. Masks are required, and temperatures will be checked upon entering the building. Did you know that 71 viewers from 2 countries, 19 states, and 52 cities tuned in last Sunday? Archive viewership last week was 124. Were you one of them? We hope to see you in person one Sunday soon!

# IMPORTANT NOTICE

Dear Members and Friends,

At Wednesday night's Standing Committee meeting (5/19), I, along with the Board of Deacons and Board of Trustees recommended that worship return to how it was prior to the pandemic more than a year ago. After some discussion, the boards and committee agreed, it's time to get back to normal!

## Starting June 6<sup>th</sup>:

- The wearing of masks will be <u>optional</u> during worship services. If you have **not** been vaccinated, we would encourage (for your safety) you to continue wearing a mask. Parents will decide if their child(ren) will wear masks while in the Sanctuary or during Sunday School.
- You will no longer need to call the church office to let us know you will be at worship, and temperatures will **not** be taken upon entering the building.
- In addition to the double doors, you may also enter and exit through the front doors.
- All pew cushions, hymnals, and Bibles will be returned to the Sanctuary.
- Worship folders and the order of worship we once knew will return. You can pick them up by the upper-level elevator and front door entrance. Offering plates will be available at both locations; communion packets will be there as well on the first Sunday of the month.
- I will be greeting worshipers (shaking hands) on the front lawn with those who feel comfortable doing so.

As was the case when the pandemic began, we may need to make some adjustments moving forward, please be patient.

With the arrival of your new minister (Rev. Rae) at the end of July, we believe it is important for him to observe worship as we have been accustomed to these many years.

The "live" web streaming of the 9 a.m. service will continue to be offered for those unable to attend in person.

As Head Trustee, Rich Chalifoux has stated numerous times, "...our mission is to continue advancing the work of and Good News of Jesus Christ. We cannot effectively do what we are called to do without being fully open."

This is an exciting time in our church. We have a wonderful story to continue telling, and there are many more people in the communities where we live that need to hear it!

If you've been away from the church, it's time to come home. You've been missed!
