Pastor's Corner

Mother Teresa, when asked about her ministry to humanity, once quipped, "I'm a little pencil in the hand of a writing God who is sending a love letter to the world." So, too, it is true with our lives when we decide to begin this journey of faith taking strides to become our best selves. We soon come to see that our lives are a narrative being penned by a divine author.

Now this sounds wonderful in theory, until we remember that there is a process to creative writing that is much more messy and laborious than its final product. See if this sounds familiar... to begin, you just decide to start, to put pencil to paper or fingers to keys, right? Well, yes... that is, after all of the pencils in the house have been sharpened, twice; your desk has been rearranged, the windows cleaned (because, of course, there is no better time for this than just before sitting down to write). Then finally, after a couple of false starts and crossed out words, you start.

The process continues, ideas begin to flow until, with a grateful sigh and a cry of jubilee, the process is finished. That is, until the editing begins. A process that feels like first discovering that the man in the red suit at Christmas is not who you thought him to be. Simply said, it takes some of the magic away! I think we can all agree, there is often little glamour in the process and it often gets worse before it gets better.

Our lives are much the same way. When we begin a new narrative or take a leap from the surety of our safe nesting places, beginning to grow and evolve, our lives often look worse before they look better. Our individual lives are works in the raw, unfinished symphonies, papers in the middle of ongoing edits..., before being polished and improved.

God often uses the circumstances of life to do this, to edit and shape our narrative. This is not always a pleasant process but the good news is that, "He who has begun a good work in you will see it to completion, until the day of Jesus Christ." The great news is that God will not abandon us in the middle of this process. He is constantly working with us to create a Pulitzer Prize winning masterpiece from the painstakingly human drafts of our lives.

This realization, the simple acknowledgment of this process, can help moments of frustration seem small when compared to the hope of the final work. My hope for you is that at times when your story seems on hold, when it seems inconsistent or when you are not certain how your next chapter will turn out, that you will remember: no matter how frustrating it seems in the moment, your life is still beautiful. It is still a part of the greatest love story ever penned, by a writing God. After all, as Scriptures reminds us, "YOU are a letter from Christ... written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts." - 2 Corinthians 3:3

Online Giving Updates

If you already have an online giving account through Vanco, please note they recently updated their e-giving page. This means next time you log in to your account, (either through the Vanco website, through the Vanco Give + App for iPhone/Android/tablets, or via the green "Donate Now" button on our church website), you will be asked to update your payment information and also your schedule of offering (one-time, weekly, bi-monthly or monthly).

New Online Giving Accounts

If you have never signed up for online giving but would like to, please follow these guidelines:

You can use your checking account, your savings account, or a debit/credit card. Here's how to sign up:

- 1. Go to our church website <u>www.prestoncitycongregational.org</u> and click on the green "Donate Now" tab on the right side of the home page.
- 2. If this is your first time on the donation page, click on "Sign Up" in the upper right corner. Follow the steps to complete your profile and set up a personal password for your account.
- 3. Once your online profile is set up, click on the green "Donate Now" tab and type in your email address and password to access your account. Then follow the steps to add either your checking account number, savings account number, or debit/credit card information. You can make a one-time offering, or a periodic (weekly, bi-monthly or monthly) offering. Important note: transactions cannot be processed on Sundays, so choose the following Monday as the processing date.

Additional notes:

- If you would like to make a repeating offering, just leave the end date blank and your offering will follow the same schedule. You can log into your account any time to change the amount, the frequency, or to stop your offering
- If you close the bank account or credit/debit card that is on file with your online giving profile, please remember to update your account information
- In addition to the church website, you can also access your online giving account through a free app on your iPhone, Android phone or tablet. Simply go to the App Store or the Google Play Store and load the "GivePlus" app by Vanco. After loading the app, it will prompt you to type in the church name, so type/select Preston City Congregational.
