# **Pastor's Corner**

Don't Give Up!

"Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize." 1 Corinthians 9:24

One of the most inspiring races I have ever watched was at the 1992 Olympics in Barcelona. David Redman was a British born athlete who captivated the world's attention and, years later, my own. Interestingly enough however, Redman galvanized the attention of many but not because he won a medal that year. That's right, there was no gold, silver or bronze medal for Redman that Olympic season. No, David Redman's story resonates for a much different reason. While running the 400 meters in a semi-final race, Redman tore his hamstring. Painful!!! But, what's transcendent about his story is that, knowing there was no chance of a win, Redman still decided to finish the race anyway. Despite the severe pain, and even when it meant that his hobbling to the finish line before millions of people would leave him in dead last place. What an inspiration! This story should also encourage all of us to never quit.

In 1 Corinthians, did you know that Paul compares the spiritual journey of each believer to a race? Perhaps he does so aptly considering the many difficulties and pains that threaten to delay our own life's journey at times. Christ said it this way: in paraphrase, "as long as we live in this life, we will have trouble." (John 16:33). All of us experience setbacks. All of us, in measure, come to know what David Redman must have felt, in part, that morning in Barcelona. Redman's story and strength not to give up during his moment of trials and tribulations should encourage each of us to always fight the urge to quit, when we experience setbacks and we all do.

The setbacks we experience don't have to be a source of guilt and shame when we realize that God is not about creating perfection in our lives but rather maturity. A perfectionist will always see their shortcomings but those who seek maturity can always take the opportunity to see progress; even when their journey is checkered by mistakes or failure. It's that quiet, confidence of faith in a power greater than ourselves that causes us to look at tempest and trial and proclaim that the resilience of the one within us is greater than the tempest of the world without. When we do this, then we have gained spiritual maturity. This mastery over our fears is not easy and sometimes we need help. That is what I love about Redman's story. You see once Redman knew that the race was lost due to injury, he collapses to one knee with disappointment in his eyes. However, then he experienced an epiphany and decided not to give up! After he painfully hobbles along by himself a few steps, something changes. His father, who was in the stands, saw Redman's attempt to continue the race in spite of the pain he was experiencing. His father rushed from the stands, jumped the barricade and put his arms around his son while supporting part of his son's weight as he hobbled the rest of the way to the finish line.

Here's the good news: you have a heavenly Father who loves you just that much. He sees you attempting to continue in spite of the pains in your life. When you are fighting the urge to quit, while still employing wisdom, prayer and common reasoning towards your life's purpose and pursuit, then God uses the confluence of events and circumstances to rush from the stands of eternity to give you the strength and support you need to get to the finish. I implore you this week to keep fighting; fight even stronger and know that if you just keep moving toward the direction of God's best for your life, you will reach the finish line. On that day, your reward will not be a gold, silver or bronze medal. But rather the beauty of hearing these words, "well done, my good and faithful servant."
