Pastor's Corner

The Courage to Act

Similar to the days we live in now, the original Disciples of Christ lived in a constantly shifting political and social landscape. These shifting changes meant that, like it is for us, the disciples of old needed to be able to act quickly and adaptively. Although, it takes a certain mindset to truly understand the sentiment "as our case is new, we must think and act anew" and to readily embrace change and uncertainty. Perhaps that's why Jesus selected untraditional faith leaders like the passionate Peter.

Peter, the Apostle, was always a man of action. Perhaps, to an extreme, he was impetuous at times. Often, his propensity to action before a thought process was complete, caused him to fail in spectacular ways. However, instead of being condemned, a measure of Peter's behavior should be lauded. After all, it is courage, and not caution, that leads to great success.

Yes, Peter's impulsive behavior meant that he was often viewed as unpolished, raw and unrefined. Although Peter's pursuit of God's best for both his life and his love for God was authentic and pure. Far from contrived and restrained, Peter's love was tangible and bold. But, oh how flawed it was...... When Peter tried to walk on water, he sank. When he argued with Christ, he lost. And finally, when he tested his own loyalty, he betrayed.

Yet, in spite of all of this anguish, Peter remains a seminal hero in our Christian faith. **Perhaps, Peter is a good example, serving to remind us that perfection is not required to please God, but rather the possession of a radiant, bold faith that is not afraid to act.** Sometimes, not thinking before we act, is a positive. This lack of thought becomes the dogged determination to move in the course of what is just or true without concern for ourselves. It is the same impulse that defines every good Samaritan's actions. In fact, it is actually the overthinking that has led to the faltering of more than one Christian's faith. The overthinking of your own will, sometimes stops us from truly proclaiming God's "thine will be done," or "nevertheless at thine word."

Perhaps Peter's life is a reminder to us of this: that when we shoot our arrows of purpose, intentionality, and with resolve, but we miss our targets morally, emotionally, or spiritually, our faith demands ONE thing of us; continued ACTION! Peter's brand of sometimes impulsive but always courageous faith demands that we pick up our arrows and try again.
