### **Pastor's Corner**

Several years ago, a psychiatrist from the University of British Columbia reported that people who warmly greet strangers live a happier, healthier, and more fulfilled life! No really! They asked the participants of the study to enter a busy coffee shop and grab a beverage. Half would get in and out, and half would strike up a conversation with the cashier. The research found that those who randomly were assigned to turn this economic transaction into a quick social interaction left Starbucks in a better mood and they even felt a greater sense of belonging in their communities.

Now, we could spend time doubting this statistic or questioning how in the world researchers set the controls for such a study, but this is not really news to Christians. We are told as much in the Gospels. Remember the person who approached Jesus and asked, "How can I inherit eternal life?" (I translate "eternal life" to also include greater "life" now or an ultimate sense of fulfillment, happiness, and great health, wouldn't you?) Jesus answered, "You should love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, and strength, AND YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF." And the question was asked, "Who is my neighbor?" The Gospels declare that it is the stranger, the "least of these."

Living a joyous, fulfilled, and healthy life is achieved by loving God and the neighbors around you-- and you just never know who the neighbor is going to be!
