## **Pastor's Corner**

### **NO MATTER WHAT, GOD LOVES US!**

Have not I commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the Lord thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest.

Joshua 1:9

The start to the Lenten season is almost here and I want to encourage you to choose to put your hope in the Father. You won't be disappointed. Trust Him because He is faithful and He loves us. Find rest for your soul in knowing that He is good, and He has good things in store for your future and the future of the church.

If you are carrying frustration, worried about the future or anxious about something, it's usually a clear sign that your hope is in the wrong place and you are not trusting God's Love for us.
