#### **Pastor's Corner**

#### Finding Balance

"Life is like riding a bicycle. To keep your balance, you must keep moving.

-Albert Einstein

The other day, while out for a drive, I observed a beautiful family moment. For what appeared to be the first time, a father was teaching his little girl how to ride a bike. The father held on to the young child for as long as he could to stabilize her and the bike with his hands. Once the little girl was stabilized, the father finally let go! For the remainder of this heartwarming moment, the dad ran behind his daughter, trying to catch up as the young child wobbled from one side of the pavement to the other.

Because we kept driving, I didn't get a chance to see the child's final moments of her test ride. However, it reminded me of how God teaches us to grow in our faith. As we all come to discover, the universe often starts out by placing its supportive hands around us to guide us. Originally, these hands came in the form of parents, teachers, tutors, and/or other mentors of one kind or another. And then, when we are relatively stable or have mastered the obligatory "training wheel phases" of the particular level of life or career we find ourselves in, it's time to let us go. These are the moments when our faith is tested and, oh boy, do we wobble! We often say the wrong things in anger to those we love and are sometimes less than charitable to co-workers. We struggle to contain our frustration and remain emotionally upright; we fight to be better and not bitter; and, sometimes, we even wrestle with our belief in God's plan for our lives altogether.

Listen to how the seasoned truth cyclist, Apostle Paul, who wrote significant portions of the New Testament, describes his own struggles to maintain balance when tested: "I have this desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. For I do not do the good I want to do. Instead, I keep on doing the evil I do not want to do... oh, wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death?" (Romans 7: 15-20)

Who knew? Even a seasoned spiritual seeker points out here in his candid confession of his constant struggle to remain upright in his faith walk with God. We understand the frustration well, as Paul's struggles are mirrored in our own daily lives. Paul ends with this question: "who will rescue me...?"

Isn't it wonderful to know that we are not alone on this journey, even when it feels like we are riding alone without divine hands of comfort to guide us when our own world is wobbling out of control? Even when we are heading straight for a "face plant" for the fifth time in a week! The truth is that even in these moments of panic, even when we feel alone, the loving hands of the divine are right behind us. The universe is ready to step in and pick us up when we acknowledge our setbacks, dusting us off, wiping away our tears, and ready to restore balance to our lives so we may try again.... Sometimes these reminders of balance and aid come from friends and family; sometimes they are reminders to self to dig deep and try again.

Whatever the specifics of your fight may be, **or** if you have felt the struggles of life lately, then I invite you to say the following prayer out loud with me: "Creator, thank you for your loving hand of guidance. Help restore balance to my life that makes me more present for the tribe you have entrusted me and, ultimately, for my purpose on this earth." Above all, even if you should fall down this week, get back up and KEEP MOVING FORWARD.
