Pastor's Corner

On Belay!

"On Belay!" were the words I heard yelled from behind me. "ARE YOU CERTAIN?" were the words I wanted to yell in return as I prepared for my first rock climbing experience. The moment I heard those two words, there was a real sudden jolt of fear. I was now committed to trusting the vigilant mind and skillful hands of the one holding the rope attached to my harness. To be truthful, it was not easy for me to trust that day. However, guess what? I made it safely up the rough and rugged terrain to the top.

In our spiritual journey with God, it too, is not always easy to trust the promises of God. However, this is where faith comes in; but what is faith? The apostle Paul said that "faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1). Wow, faith is the evidence of things you cannot see. That day, as I climbed the wall, I was tempted to continue glancing behind me, making sure the Belayer was ready to do his part supporting me in case my foot slipped. I soon realized that I could not continue moving forward if I was paralyzed by fear and constantly looking behind me. I just needed to trust.

In life, God is constantly challenging us to soar to new heights, which may mean navigating through tough and difficult terrain. It can be extremely difficult to take that initial step of faith or to continue climbing when life is tough. Thoughts bombard us like, "what if I fail?"," "...I've never done that before," "What will others think?" However, it is rarely advisable to take counsel of your fears.

The truth is - you will fail. You will stumble and slip at times. But it is at these moments when our faith in the skillful hands of the One who holds us up is stretched the most. The Book of Proverbs simply states it this way: "No matter how many times [they trip], God-loyal people don't stay down long; Soon they're up on their feet." (Proverbs 24:16). In this life, we will slip. However, though we may slip or stumble at times, we will not utterly fall because the Lord has promised to hold us up with his skillful hands.

We are each on a precarious journey of faith, but continuing to climb is the only way for our lives to reach the summit of purpose. Today, the inward voice of God bids us to climb higher towards purpose and destiny. Today, if you are deciding whether to climb higher or remain comfortable where you are, my prayer is that you will choose to stretch your faith. To get quiet, still, and attentive before God, because when you do, you may just hear the Spirit calling out, "On Belay!"

Thank you to those who sign up to assist and continue to make this a successful mission for our church.


MEMORIAL BRICK GARDEN

It is a chance to honor our loved ones in a lasting place.


