
ADULT CHOIR

FROM THE MINISTER...

Spread Your Wings

"Like an eagle that stirs up its nest, that flutters over its young... the Lord led them." (Deuteronomy 32:11,12)

Do you know how an eagle first learns to soar? It begins with discomfort. That's right; the majestic, seemingly effortless ability of an eagle to dominate the sky with beauty and grace all begins with a little discomfort!

When the eaglets are young, the nest is a safe and comfortable place. It's a place where they are fed and cared for with little effort on their own part. However, as they begin to mature and grow, not only does the physical space of the nest become a precious commodity, which is itself uncomfortable. But, particularly the mother eagle intentionally begins rearranging the nest. She causes sticks and twigs that once lay flat and smooth at the bottom of the nest to now protrude at awkward angles, denying the young eaglets the ability to feel settled regardless of where they turn. This prodding and prompting continues until they are urged to leave the nest, by spreading their wings and attempting to do what they have seen their mother do countless times—soar.

God encourages us, His children, to spread our wings in much the same way. During our process of growth, we will find, in time, circumstances that were once tolerable, if not completely comfortable, begin to protrude in ways that cause severe irritation and discomfort. Sure, sometimes this feeling of discomfort is just life being life. Sometimes, it is no more than the daily annoyances that come from sharing this earth with 7 billion other people; it's just life. However, at other moments, particularly when the discomfort is severe and continuous, God may be using that discomfort to prompt us to grow and evolve past our confining circumstances. Although each individual circumstance is always particular, God's methods of prompting us remain familiar.

One theologian framed it this way, "We can ignore even pleasure. But pain insists on being attended to. God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our conscience, but shouts in our pains: it is his megaphone to rouse a deaf world." (C.S. Lewis). Although it is often difficult to see discomfort as a positive, I implore you the next time you face a series of discomforting moments to stop and consider. Could it be that you really do have the most annoying coworkers in the world? Or that yes, everyone really would be happier if they saw things the way you do? That could be true? But then again, maybe it's more that you are seeing with eyes of vision that are better adjusted to the environment you are heading towards than the one you're currently in... Maybe, feeling the discomfort of a situation, a hyper-awareness that is more acute now than ever before, is simply because your nest is becoming too small and too limiting. Perhaps you are being positioned to spread your wings and attempt to soar to new and higher heights.

At best, our times of trial and pain remind us that we are each on a journey and that standing still is the quickest way for our lives to atrophy. The poking and prodding of life helps us to remain mobile towards purpose and destiny, which is often the best course of action. And when we encounter pain during our journey, it becomes a good reminder to make sure we are moving towards God's best purpose for us, His children.

My prayer for you is that when times of discomfort arise, you will look up toward the source of light and healing and take a moment to consider how your challenges, although unsettling, might prompt you to spread your wings and soar!


