#### Pack a Christmas Shoebox for Operation Christmas Child!

Many of you know that the church is participating in Operation Christmas Child, a mission sponsored by Samaritan's Purse that has brought Christmas joy to countless needy children around the world for many years.

Sample boxes and ideas for what to include in a shoebox have been displayed during coffee hours for several weeks. Boxes should be brought to church by the second week in November. National Collection Week is the third week of November, so **the last day to bring boxes will be Sunday, November 13**. Volunteers will deliver our shoeboxes to the nearest collection site.

Important things to know are:

- · Use a sturdy standard-sized shoebox.
- · Fill it with small toys, personal care items, schools supplies, and accessories.
- Do not include candy, gum, toothpaste, used items, "war" toys, food, lotions, aerosol cans, or vitamins/medications.
- A donation of \$10 per box will cover shipping costs.

Each box should be customized for one of these categories: boys 2-4 years old, 5-9 years old, 10-14 years old; girls 2-4 years old, 5-9 years old, 10-14 years old. The Dollar Store is a good place to start your shopping.

A visit online to Samaritanspurse.org/OCC provides even more information, including where boxes are sent, how to track your box, and other more detailed information. A heartwarming video depicts the much-anticipated arrival of delivery trucks and planes to villages and children whose Christmas is greatly enriched by the loving care of people around the world who take time to participate in Operation Christmas Child.


