#### FROM THE DESK OF REV. MARK

Hello in writing, Church!

It's so exciting to be with the people of Preston City Congregational for a little while. I've never been an interim pastor before. Okay, co-interim with Stan, the tall guy who knows all your names, birthdates, and health updates. I'm in awe of his ministerial gifts, but in a good way. His pastoral offerings make me want to "raise my game" when I'm with each of you. Thank you, Stan.

But I also know that, for many of you, you will come to know me mainly from Sunday morning sermons. So let me tell you about my preaching journey, and how I came to where I am today.

I started out preaching as a youth minister, trying to save the world for Jesus. The difficulty with such preaching is every person, every sermon, becomes a zero-sum encounter, a win-lose scenario. Friends, God's people are beloved children of a loving Eternal Father. Preaching with only salvation in mind became too easy to lose sight of that loving God when all your effort was in bringing people to faith.

Next, I became an educative preacher, a post-seminary professor of the pulpit. I thought that I could teach the people in the pews about the Bible's relevance and accuracy (seminary calls that type of preaching "apologetics"). I believed that if I could convince people of the truthfulness of Christianity, people would be won over by the knowledge within my arguments. However, schooling without connection only makes people better educated agnostics, not actual disciples. Christianity has never been about what you know, but who you know. Education is an important aspect of the faith, but not as crucial as relationship.

Interestingly, one of my last preaching presentations was what I might call Christian Self-Improvement. I had gotten involved in an organization called Iron Sharpens Iron, a ministry that is still active in New England. The ministry sought to make men better sons, husbands, and fathers. While there is certainly nothing wrong with that goal, I do think it became the most judgmental period of my preaching career. Too many assumptions about people and their lives. We already struggle with enough shame and guilt without hearing about it regularly.

Now, while each of these preaching journeys has some merit, and can be a small part of any sermon, most of the above forgets that faith is primarily a bond with the Almighty. Scripture is a guide, but not the goal. Curiously, most of the time when Jesus used Scripture, then the Old Testament, it was to correct hypocrisy. Most of Jesus' Scripture quotations are spoken to Scribes and Pharisees. To us? To the people in the pews? He told stories.

And so, unless you want to be a Scribe or a Pharisee, I'm going to share my journey of faith with you from the pulpit; I want to invite you to take from my story what is meaningful for yours. My major themes are grace, forgiveness, and Immanuel (God with us). You won't have to look far to see a humble embodiment of those behaviors. My colleague, your long-serving pastor, is a marvelous demonstration of them.

See you soon. And, by the way. I love a good story. Especially yours! Grace and Peace,
