The correct answer, I believe, is "They're all my favorites; *Hope, Peace, Joy and love!*" Each candle should represent something we desire in our lives every day and long-past Christmas.

#### 325TH ANNIVERSARY NEWS

The 325<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our church is now underway! To date, we've dedicated the stone acknowledging this historic milestone. It's located on the annex lawn between the two flag poles. If you haven't seen it, stop by. It's impressive!

Wasn't the organ concert on December 10<sup>th</sup> a glorious event? We thank Robert Potterton for his fine presentation of classical organ compositions as well as the light-hearted music from several well-known Christmas movies. It was a wonderful afternoon of music, complete with a reception in Halls' Hall! Thank you to all who made it possible.

Did you know that a choral piece marking the 325<sup>th</sup> year is now "in the works?" Joseph Martin, who composed "House of Grace" for our church's 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary (1998) was commissioned to write another piece exclusively for our church. It will premiere at the anniversary worship service scheduled for November 2024. A special choir will be formed from the congregation to sing it for the first time. After November, the anthem will be available for purchase by choirs across the United States. There will be an inscription on the music stating that it was commissioned by our church on the occasion of the 325<sup>th</sup> anniversary!

To offset the cost of this commissioned piece exclusively for our church, we are seeking 18 individuals or families, to donate \$100.
