#### FROM THE DESK OF REV. STAN

#### 325 and still alive! That's something to celebrate!

On November 16, we will begin a year-long observance of our church's existence. Once only an idea, a thought, twelve men stood on the "grassy knoll" just outside our present church building and said, *This is a good place to build a church! (My words).* Their idea caught on; the townspeople agreed. It wasn't long before the construction a of crude, wooden structure, with no heat or lights took shape. Today, we call it a church, but back then the people referred to it as a *Meeting House.* The building served several purposes; it was not only a place of worship, but a building where town meetings were held. Interestingly, there are still some old, historic, Congregational Churches (congregations) around New England that refer to their church as a Meeting House. Call it what you will, it was a place where people of faith could *freely* gather and worship God in a way they believed was best. In a way that would honor and glorify God.

Imagine it, 78 years after the landing of the Mayflower in Plymouth, Massachusetts, descendants of some of those brave souls (Pilgrims) ventured out to explore the wilderness around them. Eventually, some of them made their way to a place called Connecticut, and discovered land with possibility! Some decided to settle in the area, build their homes, and raise their family. They named the area "Preston," after a town in England, the country they left behind in search of freedom, especially religious freedom, and more. The Congregational church is often referred to as "The Church of the Pilgrims." Like our forebears, our church believes strongly in freedom, especially religious freedom. The head of our church is Jesus Christ only! Not a King, not a Pope. And the voice of the congregation, through voting, determines the direction in which the church will go -- of course, after much prayerful consideration.

You will be hearing more about programs and events that are "in the works" for the 3-2-5 celebration. It is hoped that you will attend many of them, and consider inviting a friend to enjoy them with you.

The Christian Church is facing tough times today; declining attendance, financial issues, and a lack of interest. God has been faithful to us. He has brought us to this moment in time. Let's celebrate it and give thanks.
