From the desk of Rev. Mark...

Fall is my favorite season of the year. The colors are majestic. The air is warm, but not too hot. Clyde's Cider Mill has donuts! The World Series (baseball is my favorite sport) gets underway. And some of my most beloved instrumental music derives from the season (think George Winston's Autumn album and Vivaldi's Four Seasons Concerto piece, also called, "Autumn"). If, as the Psalmist says, "the Heavens declare the glory of God" (Psalm 19:1), then what can a heavenly fall season teach us about ourselves? I can think of a couple of things:

First, we should APPRECIATE GOD-GIVEN GIFTS. Autumn brings an abundance of gifts in fall colors and textures: reds, oranges, yellows, golds, and rust tones to delight the senses. We should take time to consider our own God-given bounty of gifts. And we should ask ourselves if we are paying attention to them. For instance, for many years, because I enjoy preaching, I failed to realize that my best gift might well be listening to others who are struggling. What beautiful God-given gift might you be underappreciating? Look for the bright colors within!

Next, CONNECT WITH YOUR SHADOW. After the long, bright, sunlit days of summer, autumn brings earlier sunsets and longer shadows. It's an ideal time for thoughtful introspection and shining the light of awareness on our own shadow parts. One shadow I struggle with is my need to be an inveterate people-pleaser. I want (need?) people to be happy with me. How does that shadow get in the way of my being all that God wants me to be?

Third, LEARN TO LET GO. Trees willingly and naturally shed their leaves after putting on a radiant fall show of colors. Is there anything in your life that's ready to be released? Enjoy the brilliance of all that has ripened and come to fruition, but be willing to let go; it will pave the way for new beginnings. This past month I let go of the idea that I would be an administrator at my hospital. I was asked, I declined, and I let it go. I love patient care, not management, despite the benefits. I feel lighter. And ready for the right next thing.

Fourth, SAVE FOR LEAN TIMES. Even as birds and woodland creatures are enjoying the abundance of fall, they are also storing away portions of their autumn harvest and preparing for leaner times. Enjoy the blessings of the season, but remember to plan for the future. One of the best reasons I know for tithing is that it demands that we budget our resources well. Most of us can't be generous unless we plan for it.

Finally, FIND BALANCE. In a world of duality, balance is key. The autumn equinox signals equal amounts of night and day, serving as a reminder to find balance in our own lives. Family, Work, and Self. With Faith over all of them. Sometimes they overlap, sometimes they don't. What's crying out for attention in your life this autumn because the balance is out of whack? "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven," (Ecclesiastes 3:1) says Scripture. The season is autumn. What matter under heaven might we learn from it?
