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From the Minister... CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

(Part Two)

Last month in this column, I mentioned that the bylaws committee was charged at the Annual Meeting (February 12th) to create appropriate wording for a "one membership list." This new list would replace the present Active/Inactive membership list which has been the practice of our church for years; I would say probably since the founding (1698)!

BÁCKGROUND

Accurate record keeping has always been very important in Congregational churches; baptisms, weddings, funerals, and church membership. It still is! In the early days of our church, our building was called a "Meeting House." It was a gathering place for the town's people, where non-church meetings were held and important decisions decided. For years, the early church building was like a town hall. I find it interesting that after all these years people STILL come into the church office, seeking information about an ancestor; their baptismal date, where they are buried, when they joined the church, who they married, etc. If it were not for the accurate record keeping of our church clerks through the years, this information, sought by relatives, would be difficult to obtain.

TODAY

In an effort to make record keeping simple, and to be "nice," and "not offend," or "hurt the feelings" of members who have not been seen at

worship for a long time (in some cases years), those who attended the Annual Meeting voted to explore the possibility of having a "one membership list." Members will vote on accepting this new list at the 2014 Annual Meeting. The "one membership list" would make no distinction between active and inactive members. Everyone, regardless of whether or not they attend the services of the church would have the same status, MEMBER. Likewise, everyone would have the same privileges of membership, namely, to VOTE on important issues that may come before the church. To me, the thought of this idea is dangerous, and should be carefully considered before any new bylaw vote is taken. The present membership must think about the future church.

While I always want our church to be nice to everyone, I also want our church to do what is right and fair for the church we love – today, and especially in the years to come.

The bylaw committee has begun making "proposed" changes. We removed the word "active" form our bylaws, and when we did, we began to see how that one word can impact our church – and not always for the better.

Yes, I want us to be nice to everyone connected to our wonderful church, but I also want us to do what is right. Come to the meeting on April 14th, at Noon, and hear more!
