From the Minister...

IN TIMES LIKE THESE

This is a verse to one of my favorite hymns:

In times like these, you need a Savior, In times like these you need an anchor; Be very sure, be very sure, Your anchor holds and grips the solid Rock!

I've often thought of these words during times of great sadness and tragedy; 911, the school shootings in Columbine, the Virginia Tech school shootings, the shooting of Congresswoman Gabby Giffords, and now, the horrific school shootings at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown, CT where 20 children and 6 adults were brutally murdered. Life will never be "the same" for anyone in Newtown, or, for us as a nation. Events like these affect us and change the way we look at life.

"We live in a very different world." We've heard these words too many times following the increasing, senseless tragedies happening more and more frequently in our country.

So, how do we continue living our lives in a different, and dangerous world? As we have heard and read, the answers will vary, depending on who you ask.

For me, the answer is to remember that in life and in death I ultimately belong to God; the anchor. The Rock. For me, remembering this truth gives me faith to believe that He WILL take care of me no matter how out-of-control and evil the world becomes; I am His. Forever! This is what His Word tells us.

Those who lost their lives belong to Him again; in a better place that we cannot begin to imagine or explain. And one day, we, too, will live with Him. I understand that when terrifying events like Newtown occur, that many of those who are grieving are not ready to hear or even consider my point of view, but one day, maybe they will.

I believe you need faith *before* difficult times come into your life; faith that sees beyond this world to a new and better world. If you don't have faith, events like the ones I've mentioned may soon overwhelm you, and keep you from seeing all that is good around us. And when that happens, evil claims another victim – YOU!

Do not allow any tragedy to *pull* you away from God. Instead, let it *push* you closer to him, trusting that he will be with you in your sorrow, helping you to understand, cope, and discover that life can, and must go on.

In times like these you need more than yourself, you need a Savior.

Pray daily for others, chances are, someone is praying for you!
