BE GREAT!

The world often refers to certain athletes as "The Greatest." They are given that title because they are the best at what they do. Muhammad Ali, Babe Ruth, Michael Phelps, Simone Biles are just a few that come to mind. They deserve the title; they've worked hard, and sacrificed a lot to be the best, the greatest in their sport.

Jesus talks about being great. But his measure for greatness isn't how many fights you've fought and won, or homeruns you've hit in your career, or gold medals around your neck, or incredible back flips you can do. While these statistics are impressive to the fans (the world). Jesus says, *"You want to be great? BE A SERVANT!"*

How do we become great in the eyes of the One who matters most? Let me remind you of a few ways I mentioned in a recent sermon:

- ✓ <u>Let Christ be your model.</u> He put others first. He didn't come to be served, he came to serve others (Mark 10:45).
- ✓ Put yourself last, and others first. Remember, life is *not* all about you! The world will know that you belong to Christ by loving others (John 13:35).
- ✓ Show your love for God by loving others. If you see a need, do what you can to help someone, even the stranger. You'll feel great afterward. Christ *commands* us to love each other (John 15:12).
- ✓ <u>Use your gifts and resources in order to</u> <u>serve.</u> "Use them well *to serve* one another" (I Peter 4:10).

Each of us has the ability to serve others. Often times, it costs us nothing to do so, sometimes it does. Either way, it's the right thing to do.

From time-to-time in the months ahead there will be opportunities to serve others in our church and communities. Some things will be easy while others will require a little more from you. Please consider being the person Christ asks you to be, *a servant*.

When life is finished, it won't matter how many championship belts you've worn around your waist, or that you made it into the baseball Hall of Fame, or how many gold medals you won, or world records you set or broke. In the end, what will matter most is what you did for others. The words we should all hope to hear one day are these: "*Well done, good and FAITHFUL SERVANT*!" (Matthew 25:23).


DON'T FORGET
