FROM THE DESK OF REV. MARK...

EASTER HOPE

This is my favorite Easter Story.

In the 1940s, Flagstaff, Maine was a bustling town, heavily involved in the logging industry. But by 1950, everyone was forced to leave, and what became of the town makes it very hard for visitors to return there. Whatever is left of the abandoned village of Flagstaff now lies at the bottom of the lake of the same namealmost 50 feet down at its deepest.

Where you and I see Flagstaff Lake, a woman named June Parsons sees the town where she grew up. That's because beneath the surface of this man-made lake lies the drowned ghost town of Flagstaff village. June lived in Flagstaff until she was 13 years old. But in 1950, Central Maine Power Company flooded the village of Flagstaff and several surrounding towns to make way for a hydrodam. "Because they were making a storage dam for water, a storage basin for water," June added.

Hundreds of families were forced to sell their homes and businesses to the power company, pack up, and leave.

However, what was most interesting was the people who chose to stay almost until the last day. In the months before Flagstaff was to be flooded, all improvements and repairs in the whole town were stopped. What was the use of painting a house if it were to be covered with water in six months? Why repair a window, a driveway, a broken windowpane? Why repair anything when the whole village was to be wiped out?

So, week by week, the whole town became more and more bedraggled, more gone to seed, more woebegone.

The mayor of the town, surveying the town's decline, said these words: "*Where there is no hope for the future, there is no power in the present."*

Of course, the opposite is also true: *Where there is hope for the future, there is power in the present*.

Easter is many things, my friends, but one of the most notable to me is how Easter Hope makes all our days, especially today, powerful.

Happy Easter, my friends. The resurrection is empowering.

1 Peter 1:3: "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."

> Hallelujah. He is risen! He is risen indeed!

• A visit to the Mayflower II, a full-scale reproduction of the original tall ship that brought the Pilgrims to Plymouth in 1620.

• A visit to the 17th Century English Village, a recreation of the small family and maritime community built by the Pilgrims along the shore of Plymouth Harbor.

• The Historic Patuxet Homesite, where you can learn about the home and family life of the Wampanoag culture of the 1600's.

The motorcoach will leave PCCC at 8:00 a.m. and arrive in Plymouth around 10:00 a.m. We'll depart Plymouth at 3:00 p.m. to return home.
