The decorating committee will be placing pink geraniums on the Altar on Mother's Day to honor and remember Mothers. We will be taking orders during coffee hour after



Thank you for your continuing support for this vital ministry which is more important than ever.



- A visit to the 17th Century English Village, a re-creation of the small family and maritime community built by the Pilgrims along the shore of Plymouth Harbor.
- The Historic Patuxet Homesite, where you can learn about the home and family life of the Wampanoag culture of the 1600's.
