From the desk of Rev. Mark

I take a certain pride in having a green, lush lawn. I love the way it looks, the way it feels, and even the way it smells. I love the process of getting it to that point. I think it's because working with my hands and concentrating on something practical is a form of meditation for me.

Recently, though, my pride turned into frustration. Despite all my early efforts this year, my yard wasn't where I thought it should be at this time. Sure, it was a little greener than the rest of the yards in my neighborhood, but it wasn't that much greener. Sure, I had fewer weeds, but I didn't have that many fewer weeds.

As I sat looking at the backyard last week, I thought, "What am I doing wrong?" Then Monday rolled around. I walked out on my side porch and it was like something had happened overnight. The grass was taller, thicker, greener — much greener than the previous week. The weeds I couldn't pull by hand had started to shrivel up and die, making way for my sought-after grass. The bare spots from the dogs had even started filling in.

As I sat there and stared like Simba overlooking his kingdom, I felt a little foolish. Not because of what I was hoping for, but because I should have known this would happen. See, spring is a funny season. Half of it is cold and rainy, while the other half is warm and sunny. I know this. It happens every year. And yet, I lost sight of that. We often grow from a place that looks or feels dreary, cold, and dark.

When I was birding in a park in Phoenix in March, there was a sign offering this mental health tip: "Sometimes when you are in a dark place, you tend to think you have been buried; what if you have been planted?"

We have been planted, as Christians, to grow with God. So I ask you to trust. Trust that as we walk through this spring, God is building strong, deep roots that will allow us to withstand what is ahead. Trust that what's being cultivated and grown beneath the surface is the only way that we can produce anything of value above it.

So it was the week of Easter, and I was just then asking the Women's Fellowship for help making the baskets and delivering them. Of course, most of them had previous commitments. Who doesn't the week of a holiday? Come Maundy Thursday, 5 of the 10 shut-ins on my list had been spoken for. On Good Friday, that went down to 2 baskets to be made and delivered. One person was extremely upset and had to back out for health reasons.

I was very tempted to throw in the towel on this whole idea of delivering baskets to the shut-ins. Something pushed me to move forward, I don't know, just maybe it was God. So Friday afterward, I went shopping and got supplies to make 8 Easter baskets. I was still not feeling very well; my stomach was upset, I had a headache, and I was tired, so putting on a smile was hard. Most days I would have just stayed home, but the baskets needed to be delivered, so I trusted God would see me through the day.


