Our next meeting is February 7th at 10A.

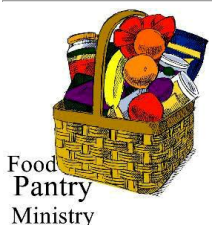

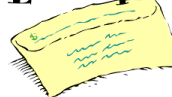
Our special collection this month is peanut butter and jelly.
